Low Tide Beach Walk Sept. 14 or Oct. 12, 2013 10:00am - 11:00am FREE Join us for a stroll along the beach to see what the tide has brought ashore. Wear old shoes that can get wet and muddy. Program will begin at the Nature Interpretive Center on Freedom Way.
